OPPORTUNITIES

1. Emerging Artist for Major Site-Specific Commission in Peak District

Arts in the Peak is an artist-led organisation which exists to sustain and develop the Peak District's distinctive cultural identity through practical and strategic support of its artists.

The Peak District:

The Peak District is an entity defined more by topography than by any commonality of identity, and Arts in the Peak is looking for ambitious ideas from artists working in any artform which respond to the Peak District as a site.

It is the most visited National Park in the UK, surrounded by cities - Sheffield to the North, Manchester to the West, Stoke, Derby and Nottingham to the South, with some 7 million people on its fringes but only 38,000 inhabitants. Viewed from space by night it is a pool of darkness surrounded by a ring of intense light.

The Peak District National Park contains 2,899 listed buildings, historic houses such as Chatsworth and Haddon Hall, the market town of Bakewell, 109 conservation areas, 74,788 hectares of Environmentally Sensitive Areas, 8,756 km of drystone walls and 50,929 hectares of moorland.

The idea of Rural:

The Peak District is characterised as a bucolic wilderness - visitors say they come for the scenery and the peace and quiet - but is also home to hundreds of artists and creative practitioners.

We would like initial proposals for big, radical projects from artists who are interested in addressing this perception of Romantic wilderness, tapping into the huge audience that currently visit the Park, and re-imagining the rural. We will then seek funding to take forward the most promising ideas.

4. Artists Required for Creative Learning Project, West Yorkshire.

Background

The Dfes Regional Partnership programme has been developed in order to disseminate the practice of Creative Partnerships to non CP funded regions, with a particular aim of making a significant impact on the professional development of teachers and in encouraging schools to adopt more creative teaching and learning approaches to the whole curriculum. In 2005/6, Wakefield LA, in collaboration with Integrate Arts Education, successfully implemented Phase 1 of this process and is currently working towards the development of Phase 2 which will take place in 25 schools across the Primary, Secondary and Special Education Sectors. Each school will require 8 days' input from each artist with a specific focus on Creative Learning and its associated pedagogies. We recognise that while there may be many skilled and experienced artists-in-education interested in the project, that this focus may be a new one. As such, we are organising a free day of training and induction for those who are interested.

The project aims to allow artists to work alongside teachers in planning and delivering lessons which can then be implemented in the school and sustained beyond the life of the project. We have worked predominantly in the art forms of Drama and Dance in Phase one and this will continue in Phase 2 although we would welcome contributions and interest from visual, literary and musical artists.

Contract

You would be linked to a school for 8 days at a rate of £180 per day. Depending on your availability, you may be placed in more than one school, each one receiving 8 days of time. Working with a teacher in the school, you will jointly plan schemes of work and deliver them to a group. The idea is that the practice can then be disseminated by the teacher to other colleagues and that the work can be repeated in the future. You will have the following skills:-

1. Approachability and a sense of humour
2. An understanding of the education system
3. Experience of working in the education system as either an artist or as a teacher of the arts
4. Expertise in a creative art form
5. A nurturing nature which can help to support and develop teachers' practice
6. An interest in the transformational power of the arts to harness learning
7. You will need to have a recent CRB check.

In the first instance:

You will need to attend the induction and training day at Woolley Hall, the Wakefield LA centre on the 25th September. This will be an opportunity to ask further questions and find out more about the project. You will not be committing to the project by attending this event; but will be discovering if the project appeals to you. 13. Green Door Open Access Printmaking Studio - Derby

Green Door is a small, newly set up open access printmaking studio with an environmentally friendly stance. It is the only such facility in Derby and aims to create a supportive environment for printmakers to use the facilities on a sessional basis when joining. It also offers a chance to exhibit and sell your work on invitation and will introduce you to others of like mind who are setting up a community to share ideas about new printmaking techniques.

At present there are two small etching presses and facilities for Photopolymer and Acrylic Relief Etching, Monoprinting and Collagraph. Relief printing can also be done, as can Artist's Bookmaking. There is a dark room complex for preparing plates. Green Door's stance is to be more environmentally safe. No acid or solvents are used and safe wash inks are being used on a trial basis.

Tuition can be served on a one to one basis or in small groups. We aim to promote an artist's printmaking community in Derby and hope to provide a support for creativity. Because it is in the centre of the city it will be a studio where no-one will be socially excluded.
